Coronavirus spreads to Beijing as China confirms 139 new cases

Zomato acquires Uber's India food delivery business, UberEats in an all-stock deal

• The deal is applicable only in India and Uber Eats will continue to operate in Bangladesh and Sri Lanka.

• Uber will get a 9.9 per cent stake in Zomato as part of the deal whose size has not been disclosed. According to sources the deal value is around \$300-350 million.

•

The move is part of Uber's strategy to be either number one or two in each of their businesses in
every country they operate. In India, Uber Eats grew very quickly to take a 12 per cent share of
the food delivery market but intense competition in India's food delivery market prevented India
Uber Eats from taking either the first or second position, which are with Zomato and Swiggy.

 According to the UN, more than 470 million people worldwide are currently unemployed or underemployed and a lack of access to decent jobs was contributing to social unrest.

 According to the UN's International Labour Organisation, the global unemployment rate (which stood at 5.4 per cent last year) has remained relatively stable over much of the past decade, overall jobless numbers are likely to increase as slowing economies reduce the number of jobs available to a growing population.

• The number of people registered as unemployed is expected to rise to 190.5 million up from 188 million in 2019, ILO said in its annual World Employment and Social Outlook report.

- If India joins the group, consisting of China, Japan, Taiwan, Korea as full members and Thailand, Vietnam, Malaysia and Indonesia as 'observers', it could mean the establishment of new kinds of telescopes — one proposed being in Tibet — that could aid the observation of new black holes and throw light on cosmic phenomena like Black Holes.

Vyom Mitra, will be the first Indian 'woman' to ride to space

- ISRO unveiled its first 'woman' astronaut "Vyom Mitra", the half-humanoid robot which will simulate human functions before real astronauts take off.
- The humanoid robot will ride to space in the first test flight of the Indian human space mission, Gaganyaan.
- Gaganyaan is the Indian crewed orbital spacecraft intended to be the formative spacecraft of the Indian Human Spaceflight Programme. The spacecraft is being designed to carry three people, and a planned upgraded version will be equipped with rendezvous and docking capability.

India falls to 51st spot in EIU's Democracy Index, China at 153

- India slipped 10 places according to The Economist Intelligence Unit, which cited "erosion of civil liberties" in the country as the primary cause for the downtrend.
- The Index provides a snapshot of the current state of democracy worldwide for 165 independent states and two territories.
- The index is based on five categories -- electoral process and pluralism; the functioning of government; political participation; political culture; and civil liberties.

Cabinet Approves Rs 4371.90 Crore For Permanent Campuses Of New NITs



- The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved the revised cost estimates (RCE) for setting up permanent campuses of new National Institutes of Technology (NITs) at a cost of Rs 4371.90 crore for 2021- 2022. The funds will be used to create campuses with modern facilities.
- NITs were established in 2009 and started functioning from the academic year 2010-2011 in their respective temporary campuses with very limited space and infrastructure.
- NITs are institutions of national importance known to be among the best teaching institutions in the field of engineering and technology and have made a remarkable presence with their high-quality technical education.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD decided to upgrade Regional Engineering Colleges (RECs to "National Institutes of Technology" (NITs) in 2002.

ICJ orders Myanmar to take emergency measures to prevent genocide of Rohingyas

- The Hague-based International Court of Justice has ordered Myanmar to take emergency measures to prevent the genocide of the Rohingyas.
- The court also ordered Myanmar to report to them in four months on the measures the country has taken to comply with the order.
- According to the ICJ, the court has the power to order provisional measures when irreparable prejudice could be caused to rights which are the subject of judicial proceedings.

World Archery lifts suspension on India enabling Indian archers to represent country

- The World Archery conditionally lifted the suspension on India, after the national federation held its elections.

- The Indian archers, who had to compete as neutral athletes at the Asian Championships because of the suspension, can now represent the country under the Tricolour. The next international tournament is Indoor World Series in Las Vegas in three weeks' time.

North Korea to attend Munich Security Conference for the first time

- North Korea will send a delegation to the Munich Security Conference for the first time in the 56-year history of the top diplomatic gathering.
- The announcement comes a month after Pyongyang declared it was abandoning moratoriums on nuclear and intercontinental ballistic missile tests. The self-imposed ban on tests had been the centrepiece of two years of nuclear diplomacy between the US and North Korea.
- Founded in 1963, the Munich Security Conference hosts hundreds of high-ranking officials and dozens of world leaders each year to discuss security challenges.

Brexit bill becomes law after receiving royal assent

- Britain's delayed and disputed Brexit bill has become law, removing the last U.K. obstacle to the country leaving the European Union in just over a week.
- The European Union's parliament also must approve the Brexit divorce deal before January 31 if Britain is to leave on time. Lawmakers in Brussels are due to vote on it next week.
- The U.K. is finally leaving the EU more than 3-1/2 years after voters narrowly opted for Brexit in a June 2016 referendum.

India's first e-waste clinic opens in Bhopal

- India's first e-waste clinic opened in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh on Friday. It would enable segregation, processing and disposal of waste from both household and commercial units.
- The e-waste clinic has been jointly set up by the Central Pollution Control Board-CPCB and Bhopal Municipal Corporation-BMC.
- Electronic waste will be collected door-to-door or could be deposited directly at the e-waste clinic.



Only 1.5% of the country's total e-waste gets recycled owing to poor infrastructure and legislation.

Republic Day chief guest Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro arrives in India

- The Brazilian President will be the chief guest at the Republic Day Parade on Sunday. He will also meet President Ram Nath Kovind tomorrow who will host a banquet in his honour.
- The Brazilian President is accompanied by eight ministers, four members of the Brazilian Parliament, senior officials and a large business delegation.
- The Prime Minister said that President Bolsonaro's visit will add strength to India-Brazil relations.

India begins coral restoration in Gulf of Kachchh

- The Zoological Survey of India (ZSI), with help from Gujarat's forest department, is attempting for the first time a process to restore coral reefs using biorock or mineral accretion technology.
- Biorock is the name given to the substance formed by electro accumulation of minerals dissolved in seawater on steel structures that are lowered onto the sea bed and are connected to a power source, in this case solar panels that float on the surface.
- The technology works by passing a small amount of electrical current through electrodes in the
 water. When a positively charged anode and negatively charged cathode are placed on the sea
 floor, with an electric current flowing between them, calcium ions combine with carbonate ions
 and adhere to the structure (cathode). This results in calcium carbonate formation. Coral larvae
 adhere to the CaCO3 and grow quickly.

In FY20, India faces first fall indirect taxes in at least two decades: Report

- India's corporate and income tax collection for the current year is likely to fall for the first time in at least two decades, over half a dozen senior tax officials told Reuters, amid a sharp fall in economic growth and cut in corporate tax rates.
- A sharp decline in demand has hit businesses, forcing companies to cut investment and jobs, denting tax collections and prompting the government to forecast 5% growth for this fiscal year the slowest in 11 years.

- The rise in reserves was mainly on account of an increase in foreign currency assets, which rose by 867 million US Dollars to 428.45 billion US Dollars.
- In the reporting week, gold reserves increased 70 million US Dollars to 28.56 billion US Dollars. The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) were up by 3 million US Dollars to 1.45 billion US Dollars.

European Parliament to vote on Kashmir, Citizenship Amendment Act

- Close on the heels of a number of critical international statements and parliamentary resolutions, the government is bracing for six scathing resolutions on both Jammu and Kashmir and the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA), 2019, that have been filed by an overwhelming majority of members in the European Parliament.
- These will be taken up for discussion and voting this week.
- Resolutions that urge an end to curbs could have a deep impact on ties between India and the European Union. The resolutions list more than a dozen different counts of actions by the government that are allegedly in violation of international norms and India's international commitments on Human Rights and at the UN Security Council, including actions in Jammu and Kashmir after the dilution of Article 370, police firing on protestors against the CAA in Uttar Pradesh etc.

Anti-satellite missile capability showcased in R-Day parade

- India showcased its Anti-Satellite (ASAT) missile capability to the world as the ASAT weapon, Mission Shakthi, developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) rolled out on the Rajpath during the 71st Republic Day parade.
- In addition, the IAF's newest inductions, Chinook heavy-lift helicopters and Apache attack helicopters, also made their debut during the flypast.

SC allows centre to introduce African cheetah to suitable habitat in India

- The Supreme Court has allowed the Centre to introduce the African cheetah to suitable habitat in India. The apex Court's decision followed a petition filed by National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) seeking permission for the introduction of the African cheetah from Namibia as rare Indian cheetah is almost extinct in the country.
- The Court also set up a three-member committee, comprising former Director Wildlife of India Ranjit Singh, Director General of Wildlife of India Dhananjay Mohan and Deputy Inspector General, Wildlife, Ministry of Environment and Forests to guide the NTCA in taking a decision on the issue.

37 Indian wetlands declared sites of international importance under Ramsar Convention

- The Ramsar Convention has declared 10 more wetlands in India as sites of international importance in a major recognition for the government's effort towards conservation and rejuvenation of its wetlands.
- With this, a total of 37 sites in the country have been recognised under the international treaty. Wetlands declared as Ramsar sites are protected under strict guidelines.
- One of the oldest inter-governmental accords, the Convention, signed in 1971 in the Iranian city
 of Ramsar, is one of the oldest inter-governmental accords for preserving the ecological character
 of wetlands.
