- The Supreme Court recently gave approval to National Tiger Conservation Authority to reintroduce African Cheetah
- Lacones scientists are saying success of this project will be challenging, and India needs its own guidelines for introduction of wild animals, in addition to IUCN template guidelines
- The Lacones is building up National Genetic Wildlife Bank which now has the germplasm of 23 species, including red panda, pygmy hog, asiatic lion and gharials.

• It is one of the few frozen zoos in the world where a repository of germplasm is stored in cryogenic conditions for possible future use.

ISRO to launch GISAT-I

- GISAT-1 or Geo Imaging Satellite-1 is India's first earth imaging satellite in a geostationary orbit.
- Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV-F10) will launch GISAT-1 on March 5th from Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.
- The GSLV flight will have a four-metre diametre ogive-shaped payload fairing being flown for the first time.

- Luxembourg has abolished fares for trains, trams and buses
- This has been done to tackle road congestion and pollution, as well as supporting low earners.
- More than half of Luxembourg's greenhouse gas emissions come from transport.

Air pollution 'pandemic' shortens lives globally by 3 years: Study

- Air pollution is causing 8.8 million premature deaths annually, according to the study.
- This scale is far greater than wars and other forms of violence, parasitic and vector-born diseases such as malaria, AIDS and smoking.
- Air pollution was found to have a greater effect on shortening lives in older people, with the exception of deaths in children aged under five in low income countries, such as Africa and South Asia.

Govt permits airlines to provide in-flight Wi-Fi services

- The Pilot-in-Command may permit the access of Internet services by passengers on board
- In-flight wifi would allow access to voice, video and data services after the flight attains an altitude of 3000m
- Two operating systems exist for aeroplane wifi- ground-based and satellite
- Ground-based wifi collects signals from nearest tower on the ground. However, this doesn't work over large water bodies
- Satellite wifi uses network of orbiting satellites to allow a connection

The Supreme Court allows dealing in cryptocurrency

- SC has quashed an earlier ban imposed by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on trading in virtual currencies such as Bitcoin.
- Cryptocurrencies are digital currencies in which encryption techniques are used to regulate the generation of units of currency and verify the transfer of funds, operating independently of a central bank.
- Bitcoin is the largest and most popular among cryptocurrencies

In 2017, Japan accepted Bitcoin as legal currency.

- National Interlinking of Rivers Authority will oversee projects, generate funds

- This will help India in expanding its plans in the Western Indian Ocean which strategically connects the South Eastern Coast of Africa
- It will also support its SAGAR (Security and Growth for all in the Region) policy

Sanitary Napkin Disposal Bags to be made mandatory from 2021

- Union Environment Minister Prakash Javedekar announced that sanitary napkin disposal bags are to be made mandatory.
- The Municipal Solid Waste (Management and Handling) rules, 2000 makes it mandatory to dispose these wastes after segregation



- However, manual segregation puts garbage collectors at risk of infection
- Hence, sanitary napkin manufacturers have to supply a biodegradable bag along with every napkin from January 2021

Quick Facts:

According to Bio-Medical Waste (Management and Handling) rules, 1998, items that are contaminated with bodily fluids should be incinerated to destroy

Delimitation Commission set up for Arunachal, Manipur, Assam, J&K, Manipur

- The commission was formed under former Supreme Court judge Ranjana Prakash Desai.
- The Delimitation for the state of Jammu and Kashmir is to be carried out according to Jammu and Kashmir reorganization act.
- For other parts of the country, delimitation is to be done based on the census 2031.
- The commission was formed under Section 3 of Delimitation Act, 2002.
- Till now, only 4 such delimitation commissions have been constituted under the act in the years 1952, 1963, 1973 and 2002.

Quick Facts:

Delimitation is the process of fixing boundaries of constituency.

54. International Affairs

Oil prices drop by 20% due to failed OPEC deal

- Saudia Arabia and its major allies tried to reduce oil production to counter the future drop in oil demand
- This drop in prices is predicted due to coronavirus spread
- However, the deal failed when Russia refused to make the deal

Quick Facts:

OPEC was founded in Baghdad, Iraq, in 1960 by its five founder members- Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia and Venezuela. OPEC currently has 14 members.

UK confirmed as first co-chair of India-led climate change initiative

- The Governing Council is the highest policy-making body of the CDRI.

132. Economy RBI reduces key policy rates due to COVID-19 crisis

- In wake of COVID-19 crisis, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has decided to:
- Reduce the policy repo rate under the liquidity adjustment facility (LAF) by 75 basis points
- Reduce the marginal standing facility (MSF) rate and the Bank Rate to 4.65 per cent from 5.40 per cent
- Reduce the reverse repo rate by 90 basis points to 4.0 per cent.
