They are a major problem this year as they are invading in wind direction, and may come in in more unpredictable waves as the wind direction changes

Quick Fact: Desert Locusts are controlled with a spray of organo-phosphate pesticides

Foundation stone for Agneeprastha, the Missile Park laid

The foundation stone for a missile park called Agneeprastha was laid at INS Kalinga.

The park aims to provide information about INS Kalinda and motivate those who are interested in missiles and missile technology

INS Kalinga is located in Visakhapatnam

1) Science and Technology

Rare space object called Active Asteroid discovered near Jupiter

Active Asteroids are celestial bodies that look like a comet but have asteroid like orbits.

The Active Asteroid near Jupiter is called 2019 LD2 and is part of an asteroid swarm called Jupiter Trojans.

2019 LD2 was discovered by the Asteroid Terrestrial-impact Last Alert System (ATLAS)

Quick Fact: Elst Pizarro was the first active asteroid to be discovered.

SpaceX becomes first private space company to send NASA astronauts to space

SpaceX has sent NASA astronauts Doug Hurley and Bob Behnken to the International Space Station

The spacecraft being used for this purpose is called Crew Dragon.



The suits worn by the astronauts inside Crew Dragon are called the Starman suits.

Quick Fact: SpaceX is the first private company in the world to return rockets back to the earth.

NPCI launches Al virtual assistant PAi

National Payment Corporation of India (NPCI) has launched an artificial intelligence (AI) based chatbot, PAi to increase financial inclusion in India

It is a 24*7 Al virtual assistant helping users understand NPCI products

NPCI products include FASTag, RuPay, UPI and AePS

Quick Fact: Artificial intelligence or Machine intelligence refers to the simulation of human intelligence in machines

Rohit Sharma nominated for Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award

BCCI has nominated Rohit Sharma for the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Awards 2020

This is the highest sporting award in India awarded for outstanding sports performance for a period of 4 years

Rohit Sharma is the first T20 cricketer to score 4 centuries and the first to score 5 ODI centuries in a single edition of the World Cup

China objects the presence of US THAAD missile in South Korea

For China, the presence of the missile indicates US interfering with its long term relations with South Korea

US has announced this step as a countermeasure against potential attacks by North Korea

THAAD is an anti-ballistic missile system and stands for Terminal High Altitude Area Defense

Rare fish, Scorpaenospsis neglecta, found in Gulf of Mannar

The fish has been found by researchers at the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute

The fish is locally called Scorpion Fish for its venomous tail which can inject venom in someone who touches it

This species has been found alive in the Indian waters for the first time.

Quick Fact: Gulf of Mannar is India's largest biosphere reserve

- 2) Policy implementation challenges faced by India in reducing economic risks

The country is developing deep sea technology for mining resources from the sea

During this operation also China was testing its deep sea capabilities

Quick Fact: Mariana trench is located in Western Pacific Ocean

2) Environment

Fire in Assam's Baghjan Oil Well

The well had blown out in May and had been leaking gas since half a month



Environmentally it has:

- 1) Affected flora and fauna by depositing gas condensate in the Maguri Beel Wetland
- 2) Killed some of the rare Gangetic Dolphins in Dibru-Saikhowa National park
- 3) Contaminated nearby paddy fields, tea gardens, wetlands and ponds

Quick Fact: Gangetic Dolphins are classified as Endangered under IUCN red list

Glenmark Pharmaceuticals' oral antiviral drug Favipiravir (Fabiflu) was approved by Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation

The antiviral drug was first approved in Japan in 2014, and has been used for viral infections.

It functions by targeting the Ribonucleic Acid (RNA) polymerase enzyme, which is required by viruses to replicate

It has shown positive results in global studies on 150 test subjects

Quick Fact: The CDSCO is headquartered in New Delhi

COVID-19 effect: No Ambubachi mela at Kamakhya for the first time

For the first time in its recorded history of 600 years, the Ambubachi mela will not be observed in Assam's Kamakhya Temple



The event is a five day mela, where lakhs of devotees and tourists assemble.

It is believed that during the monsoon rains, the creative and nurturing power of the 'menses' of Devi Kamakhya/Goddess Shakti is concentrated in the temple region.

Quick Fact: Kamakhya Temple was built by King Narakasura on Nilachal Hills. It is considered to be one of the 51 Shakti Peeths

India: Twelfth Largest Holder of US Government Securities

Treasury Securities backed by the United States Treasury Department are considered to be a very safe asset

In India, RBI invests in foreign assets as part of its prudential liquidity management measures.

The top five holders of US Government securities are: Japan, China, UK, Ireland and Luxembourg

EAG stands for Eurasian Group on Combating Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism

Vidyaben Shah was a pioneer in the field of child welfare. She had created the first Bal Bhavan in Rajkot in the 1940s.

'Decarbonising Transport in India' project to be launched by NITI Aayog

The project will:

It will be launched jointly by NITI Aayog and International Transport Forum (ITF), an intergovernmental organisation for transport policy.

Indian receiver chip "Dhruva" to receive data from Indian navigation satellites

The chip "Dhruva" can be inserted in cell phones and used for navigation inside India

It will receive this data from Indian navigation system satellites NAVIC.

The chip has been created by IIT-Bombay

'eBloodServices' mobile app launched in Delhi

The app will enable users to access information about blood availability in blood banks, as well as order up to four units of blood remotely.

This would help patients who require regular blood donation or have bleeding disorders.

Bengaluru airport: India's first airport to install AWMS technology on runway Bengaluru's Kempegowda International Airport is the first Indian airport to install the indigenous AWMS technology on its runways

The Aviation Weather Monitoring System has been developed by Bengaluru-based CSIR-National Aerospace Laboratory

It has also installed four Drishti transmissometers to measure the runway visibility range (RVR).

WHO-led coalition 'ACT-Accelerator' to fight against COVID-19

ACT-Accelerator stands for Access to COVID-19 Tools

The ACT-Accelerator is WHO's global initiative launched in April 2020

The coalition aims to develop 2 billion doses of COVID-19 vaccines by the end of 2021

Quick Fact: Indian scientist Soumya Swaminathan was the Deputy Director General of Programmes of WHO from 2017-19

NASA headquarter building named after 'Mary W.Jackson'

NASA has named the building of its headquarters after Mary W.Jackson- its first African American female engineer



Mary W. Jackson had started her career as a research mathematician and went on to work as an engineer

Her career with NASA started in 1951, when both African-Americans and females had to break a lot of barriers to succeed professionally and socially

Through her work, she inspired other women and African-Americans to take up similar opportunities.

Quick Fact: The NASA headquarters are located in Washington DC.

Toronto International Film Festival is one of the largest film festivals in the world

Due to the corona pandemic, the TIFF 2020 will be a virtual event

India becomes first country to control locusts through drones

Locusts are pests which damage crops.

They have entered India through the India-Pakistan border

The center has controlled the threat using drones and indigenously developed Ultra-low volume (ULV) sprayer

Quick Fact: The current locust swarm is an outbreak of desert locusts and has taken place in Africa, the Arabian Peninsula, South Asia and South America

2) Government Schemes

Successful completion of 3 housing schemes: 3.5 million houses handed over

The three housing schemes are:

- a) Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT)
- b) Smart Cities Mission (SCM)



c) Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana- Urban (PMAY-U)

Together, these three schemes have handed over 3.5 million houses to beneficiaries

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs marked the 5 years of successful completion of the 3 Schemes.

Nine year old dispute between Egypt, Sudan and Ethiopia moves towards resolution

The dispute has been over the Giant Ethiopian Renaissance Dam constructed over River Nile's tributary, Blue Nile, by Ethiopia.

After nine years of discussion it has been decided that the dam will not be filled unilaterally by Ethiopia.

Egypt is dependent on the river for freshwater.

Quick Fact: River Nile originates from Lake Tana in Ethiopia and then diverges into two tributaries, the Blue Nile and White Nile.

Pakistan and China sign agreement for Kohala HPP in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir

The agreement has been signed by the Government of Pakistan, State-owned Chinese Company China Three Gorges Corporation, and the Government of Azad Kashmir.

The Kohala Hydropower Plant is located on River Jhelum

It is part of China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)

World Bank Group's STARS program in six Indian states

Strengthening Teaching-Learning and Results for States (STARS) Program will improve the quality and governance of school education system in India

The program will take place in Rajasthan, Odisha, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, and Maharashtra

It will help India in bringing its aim to Education for All to realization

Project Platina: World's Largest Plasma Therapy Trial launched by Maharashtra

Plasma therapy has the following steps:

- 1) A recovered patient donates their plasma containing COVID-19 specific antibodies
- 2) The plasma is then transfused into a COVID-19 patient
- 3) The patient then develops similar antibodies for fighting the COVID-19 virus

Under Project Platina, convalescent plasma will be given to all critical patients in the state hospitals of Maharashtra

Quick Fact: Plasma is the clear component of the blood left after the cells are removed

First Plasma Bank in India at ILBS, Delhi

As per Delhi government, the Plasma Bank will be set up at the Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences.

It will be used to meet the demand for plasma as cases rise in the region.

The plasma will be donated by COVID-19 recovered patients and transfused to COVID-19 patients to support their antibody generation capacity

Ministry of Culture: Sankalp Parva drive for clean and healthy environment

A tree plantation drive is being conducted in all government offices and bodies of Ministry of Culture from 28th June to 12th July
