1st July

1) Person in News

UN honours Kerala health minister KK Shailaja for COVID-control efforts

United Nations honoured Kerala health minister for her efforts to control COVID-19 in the state on the occasion of its Public Service Day

Kerala was the first state to experience COVID-19 cases and has now flattened its curve

Invited to talk about her efforts, she explained the three strategies used in the state: Trace, Quarantine, Test, Isolate and Treat, Break the Chain and Reverse Quarantine.

2) Sports

Indian umpire Nitin Menon included into ICC's Elite Umpire Panel

Nitin Menon is the youngest umpire to be included in the panel.

He is the third Indian umpire to be included after Srinivas Venkatraghavan and Sundaram Ravi.

He will be part of the International Cricket Council's Elite Umpires Panel for the year 2020-21.

Quick Fact: The Elite Panel is a panel of cricket umpires appointed by ICC to officiate in Test and ODI matches around the world.

3) Science and Technology

Indigenously developed vaccine 'COVAXIN' gets approval for human clinical trials

COVAXIN has been developed by Bharat Biotech along with Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the National Institute of Virology (NIV)

It has received approval for Phase I and II human clinical trials by the Drug Controller General of India (DGCI)

COVAXIN is the first indigenously developed vaccine against COVID-19 which has been approved for Human Clinical Trials

Quick Fact: Bharat Biotech has also developed vaccines for Polio, Rabies, Chikungunya, Rotavirus and Zikavirus.

KK Venugopal reappointed as Attorney General for India

KK Venugopal has been reappointed as AGI by the President till August 2021.

KK Venugopal has been conferred with both Padma Vibhushan as well as the Padma Bhushan civilian honour

The Attorney General is the Chief Legal Advisor for Gol, whose term duration is decided by the President

Quick Fact: The first AGI of India was MC Setalvad

5) Defence and Security

59 Chinese apps banned on recommendation of Home Ministry

59 Chinese mobile applications, including popular ones like TikTok, CamScanner and WeChat have been banned by India

The ban has been imposed under Section 69A of the Information Technology Act

The reasons for the same have been cited as misuse of some mobile apps for stealing and transmitting user data out of India without permission, as well as engaging in activities prejudicial to sovereignty and integrity of India.

1) Environment

Uttarakhand develops India's first lichen park

A lichen is a composite organism emerging from a symbiotic relationship between algae or cyanobacteria and fungi.

The project aims to study the ecological and biological aspects of lichens.

The park will be located in Kumaon's Munsiyari, Pithoragarh district

Quick Fact: They are the best bioindicators of the pollution levels and are also used in food, perfumes, dyes and traditional medicines

2) India and the World

India and Bhutan sign their first joint venture hydropower project

The venture is for the construction of 600 MW run-of-the-river Kholongchhu project in Bhutan's Trashiyangtse

The project is slated to be completed by 2025

The project has been jointly taken up by Sutlej Jal Vidyut Nigam (SJVN) and Bhutanese Druk Green Power Corporation (DGPC)

3) Sports

'NADA INDIA' App launched for awareness about Prohibited Substances in Sports

The app has been launched by the Union Ministry for Youth Affairs and Sports

It will create awareness about prohibited substances for athletes, to prevent inadvertent use of prohibited substances and free Indian sports of doping and drug abuse

NADA is responsible for monitoring and promoting sports-related doping control programs and implementation of anti-doping policies in India

Agriculture Ministry flags off helicopter services for locust control in Rajasthan

A Bell 206-B3 helicopter has been flagged off with spray equipment to desert areas of Rajasthan for locust control

It will access areas of the desert which are inaccessible by drones

The special measures are being taken since monsoons will provide ideal breeding environment for locusts in the semi-arid/arid regions of Rajasthan, as per FAO

CogX awards are awarded to the best emerging AI technologies in the world

Eight core industries' growth rate declines by 23.4% in May 2020

Bharat Pannu secures podium place at the first VRAAM event

Lt. Col. Bharat Pannu secured podium place at the first Virtual Race Across America (VRAAM)

He secured the third position, cycling 4086 km in 12 days along with 17 participants

With this achievement, he has become the first Indian to win a podium place at an international ultracycling race

The Carnegie Corporation annually honours immigrants who have contributed to the greatness of the United States, in honour of their founder Andrew Carnegie, a Scottish immigrant who became a leading industrialist and philanthropist in US.

Dr. Siddhartha Mukherjee has won for his contribution in creating awareness about Corona safety measures in society. He is an Associate Professor of Medicine at Columbia University and is a Padma Shri and Pulitzer Prize winner.

Raj Chetty received the award for launching a real-time economic impact monitor of COVID-19.

Major General Nigar Johar has become the first female Lieutenant General of Pakistan Army

She is now the first female surgeon general of the Pakistan Army

She is part of Pakistan Army's Medical Corps.

2) Environment

A unique Urban Forest inaugurated at CAG Office, New Delhi

The urban forest will have thirty times the surface area of single-layered lawns.

It will be grown using the Miyawaki method invented by Japanese Botanist Akira Miyawaki

Using this method will increase the moisture of the forest by more than 40% and reduce the surrounding temperature by up to 14 degrees.

In Miyawaki method, native species are grown very close together so that they receive sunlight only from the top, thus increasing their vertical growth and decreasing their horizontal spread. The plants thus require minimal space and grow much faster.

Shrikant Madhav Vaidya will be the new chairman of Indian Oil Corporation (IOC)

PASSEX stands for PASSing EXercise

This was the 15th PASSEX exercise conducted by the navies and is conducted by goodwill training and understanding

Elyments: First Indian Social Media Super App to be launched on 5th July

The need for an Indian social media app has been long felt for fears related to privacy of data and data ownership

The app has been developed by Sumeru Software Solutions Private Limited.

Elyments will be available in 8 Indian languages and will host features like audio/video conference calls, public profiles for users to follow/subscribe, a secure Elyments Pay payment system, etc.

India ranks third on 'Global E-waste Monitor 2020'

The 'Global E-waste Monitor 2020' report has been published by the United Nations

- (a) 53.6 million tonnes of e-waste was generated globally in 2019, out of which only 17.4 percent was recycled
- (b) India was the third largest contributor to e-waste
- (c) China topped the list, with USA coming in second as the highest producers of e-waste

Dehing Patkai Wildlife Sanctuary to be upgraded into a National Park

Dehing Patkai was declared as an Elephant Reserve in 1992 as part of Project Elephant

In 2004, it was declared as a Wildlife Sanctuary

This decision comes in the backdrop of a controversial decision made by the National Board for Wild Life's (NBWL) to give mining rights in the nearby Eco-sensitive zone Saleki Proposed Reserved Forest, which have now been suspended

India sent its first Olympic team at the 1920 Summer Olympics at Belgium's Antwerp

The new logos will:

- a) Celebrate the tricolor
- b) Signify the value of unity, friendship, and merit
- c) Celebrate contributions of Indian sportspeople at Olympics over the last 100 years

Quick Fact: The new institutional and commercial logo has been approved by the International Olympic Committee

Israel launches its Intelligence Satellite Ofek-16 into LEO

Israel has successfully launched its intelligence satellite 'Ofek-16' into the Low Earth Orbit (LEO) from Central Israel's Palmachim Airbase

This is the 12th Ofek family satellite launched by Israel

Ofek-16 is an optoelectronic reconnaissance (intelligence) satellite and serves the purpose of monitoring the developments by Iran's Armed Forces and its nuclear program

9th July

Himachal Pradesh: First state with 100% LPG connection coverage

Himachal Pradesh is now the first Indian state where 100% households have LPG gas connections

This coverage has been possible due to:

- a) Central government's Pradhan Mantri Ujjawala Yojna
- b) State government's Himachal Grihini Suvidha Yojana

Quick Fact: LPG, Liquified Petroleum Gas, contains a mix of propane and butane

Book release by Maruti Suzuki Chaimran: Getting Competitive: A Practitioner's Guide for India

United States to withdraw from WHO by mid-2021

United States has submitted a notice to United Nations' Secretary-General to withdraw from WHO by 6th July 2021

This step has been taken by the US President in the backdrop of allegations of mishandling the coronavirus pandemic by the World Health Organisation.

In addition to the withdrawal notice, US has also talked about freezing its funds to WHO

WHO: Possibility of Airborne and Aerosol Transmission of COVID-19

As per existing WHO research and guidelines, COVID-19 infection was being spread through droplet transmission, i.e., expelled droplets from an infected person's mouth and nose.

However, recent research has shown that there is a possibility that COVID-19 infection can be spread through tiny airborne particles.

This finding is not definitive as of now, since such spread has only been studied in specific conditions like poorly ventilated areas.

Quick Fact: World Health Organization is a specialized agency of the United Nations headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland

Bhutan-China Boundary Negotiations

During June's U.N. Development Programme's Global Environment Facility (GEF) meeting, China objected to funding for development of Sakteng Wildlife Sanctuary which it sees as a disputed property

However, Bhutan has claimed long-standing sovereignty over the area.

Sakteng Wildlife Sanctuary is located in an Eastern Bhutan district which borders Arunachal Pradesh.

The ongoing dispute by China is being seen as a pressure tactic for India.

Golden Birdwing: Largest Butterfly in India

Golden Birdwing has been found to be the largest butterfly in India based on wingspan length of 194 mm

The habitat of the butterfly ranges from Uttarakhand to Shillong

Earlier, Southern Birdwing butterfly was considered to be the largest butterfly in India

A new building of Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI), Jharkhand will be named after Shyama Prasad Mukherjee

One of his major calls for India was 'One nation-one law'

Microsoft partners with NSDC to provide digital skills

Amid the corona crisis, the company Microsoft has partnered with National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) to offer digital skills to India's youth

As part of the program, 'Microsoft Learn', Microsoft's learning resource center, will be integrated with the eSkill India digital platform

This will create a digital skills ecosystem and skill Indian youth in jobs for the future.

First time for Finance Commission: An entire chapter on Health Financing

The 15th Finance Commission will devote an entire chapter on Health Financing for the first time

For this, all members will study the need and aspects of health sector along with government spending on the sector via centrally sponsored schemes

A meeting between the 15th Finance Commission and World Bank, Niti Aayog and High level group (HLG) on the health sector was also held for the same

World Health Organization (WHO) has announced elimination of rubella and measles from Sri Lanka and Maldives

In doing this, they have successfully become the first two south-east Asian countries under WHO to eliminate both rubella and measles

Quick Fact: The 11 countries in WHO's South East Asia region are India, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Thailand, Maldives, Myanmar, North Korea, Timor-Leste, Indonesia, and Nepal.

Odisha: First Indian state to use space tech and AI for monitoring government lands

Bhubaneswar Land Use Intelligence System, BLUIS, has been launched to monitor government land in the state using high-resolution satellite imagery

The need arose due to lack of transparency related to encroachment on government land

By nature, BLUIS is a web and mobile-based geo-tagged repository.

7) Government Schemes

ARHCs to be developed for Urban Migrants/Poor under PMAY-U

Cabinet has given approval for development of Affordable Rental Housing Complexes (ARHCs)

The ARHCs will provide affordable and hygienic housing to urban migrants and poor who have lost their houses in the pandemic.

ARHCs will be a sub-scheme under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U)

11th July

1) Science and Technology

Google+ rebranded as Google Currents

Google has officially rebranded Google+ as Google Currents

The new platform is tailored more towards businesses

Google+ was a social network platform which was closed in April 2019 due to low usage and data leaks.

Quick Fact: Sundar Pichai is the CEO of Google

World's first reusable PPE kits launched in India

These kits has been created by Indian manufacturing company, Loyal Textile Mills

It has been developed in collaboration with Reliance Industries Limited and Switzerland based textile innovation company- HeiQ Materials AG.

The kit has Triple Viral Shield Technology and can be washed and reused up to ten times

Nepal bans broadcasting of Indian News Channels

Nepal based Multi-System Operators have issued a broadcast ban on all Indian news channels except doordarshan

The decision has been taken upon the allegation of Indian news channels broadcasting defamatory and untrue information about Nepal's Prime Minister

Ministry of Culture published reprinted version of Mongolian Kanjur Manuscripts

Union Ministry of Culture is reprinting all the 108 volumes of Mongolian Kanjur Manuscripts under the National Mission for Manuscripts

Professor Raghuvira brought the manuscripts to India around 1956
