The Union Cabinet has approved to dissolve the Puducherry Assembly and impose President's rule in the Union territory, following the resignation of the Chief Minister, V Naryanswamy.

The decision was taken as no party claimed to form a government, following which the Lieutenant Governor had recommended President's Rule.

The approval will now be sent to the President, Ramnath Kovind and the legislative assembly of the UT will be dissolved once the President accords his permission.

World Water Day: March 22nd

World Water Day is observed to celebrate water and raise awareness about the 2.2 billion people living without any access to pure and safe water across the world. All over the world, 22nd March is a day to spread consciousness to take action towards tackling the global water crisis.

The theme of World Water Day 2021 was "Valuing water". The worth of water is much more than its productive value. It has a vast and complex value for our households, food, culture, health, education, economics and the integrity of our natural environment.

In 1993, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a resolution which stated 22nd March each year to be observed as World Day for Water.

The French Language Day's date was chosen connotatively in reference to March 20, 1970, which flags the formation of the Agency for Cultural and Technical Cooperation (ACCT), which became the International Organization of La Francophonie (OIF).

ISSF World Cup: First gold for India won by Yashaswini

Yashaswini Deswal won the first gold medal for India in the Women's 10M Air Pistol final of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup Rifle/Pistol/Shotgun.

She gathered 238.8 points to lead in her category. A second Indian shooter, Manu Bhaker, won a silver medal with 236.7 points.

Shaheed Diwas: 23rd March

Every year, March 23 is observed as Martyrs Day (Shaheed Diwas or Sarvodaya Day) to pay tribute on the death anniversary of the freedom fighters Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev Thapar, and Shivaram Rajguru, who laid their lives for the freedom of India.

It was on March 23 in 1931, in Lahore (Pakistan), that these three were hanged to death for assassinating John Saunders, a British police officer in 1928. They had mistaken him for British police superintendent James Scott, who had ordered lathi-charge, which eventually led to the death of Lala Lajpat Rai.

Shaheed Diwas is observed on March 23 to honour the sacrifice of three extraordinary freedom fighters of India. Bhagat Singh, Shivaram Rajguru and Sukhdev Thapar were hanged to death by the Britishers. They came forward at a very young age and fought bravely for the independence of India. They went on to become an inspiration to the youth of the country.

Quick Fact: Also, 30 January is observed as Martyr's Day or Shaheed Diwas in the memory of Mahatma Gandhi.

Indian armed forces, 4th strongest in the world

China has the strongest military force in the world while India stands at number four, according to a study released by defence website Military Direct.

China has the strongest military in the world, scoring 82 out of 100 points in the index. The USA, despite their enormous military budgets, comes in 2nd place with 74 points, followed by Russia with 69, India at 61 and then France with 58. ISRO Demonstrates Free Space Quantum Communication

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has announced on March 22, 2021 that it has successfully demonstrated its free-space Quantum Communication for a distance of 300 metres for the first time in India. It was demonstrated at the Space Applications Centre (SAC) in Ahmedabad in between the two line-of-sight buildings within its campus.

Several numbers of the key technologies were indigenously developed to achieve this major feat. This space quantum communication includes the use of indigenously developed NAVIC receiver for the time synchronisation in between the transmitter and receiver modules. It also includes a gimbal mechanism system instead of the bulky large-aperture telescopes for the optical alignment of the system.

ISRO's demonstration of the Free Space Quantum Communication includes the live video conferencing using the quantum-key-encrypted signals. It is a major milestone to achieve the unconditionally secured satellite data communication using the quantum technologies.

Quick Fact: Indian Regional Navigation Satellite System (IRNSS) or NAVIC NAVIC is an autonomous regional satellite navigation system which provides the accurate real-time positioning and timing services.
